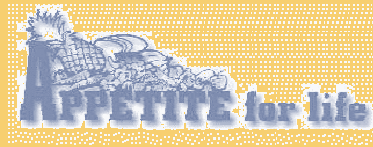
Appetite for Life, Inc. is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. All donations are tax deductible.

Who We Serve

Forget about the stereotypes...Appetite for Life's clients aren't stereotypical. Our clients cross all racial, religious, cultural and socioeconomic lines.

Some are women, some are men, some are children. They are young and old; gay and straight. They are white, African American, Asian, Hispanic and Native American.

But they all have one thing in common; they are either infected with or affected by HIV/AIDS.

Of the 322 clients Appetite for Life serves with its meal delivery and food pantry programs, 276 are HIV/AIDS patients; 56 more are their dependent children.



Impacting A Community

Touching the lives of just 300 or so people each year may not sound like much but in Escambia County, it's tremendous. The 276 HIV/AIDS patients Appetite for Life serves equals nearly 32% of all people living with HIV/AIDS in our area (documented cases excluding those who are in long-term nursing care or who are incarcerated).

A Decade of Making A Difference

Since June 17, 1997, Appetite for Life Inc. has been delivering nutritious, home-cooked meals to persons in Escambia County living with HIV and AIDS.

As of June 17, 2007, when the organization celebrated the 10th anniversary of its meal delivery program, it had provided more than 326,000 meals.
